Transportation is provided for Primary Camp. A van will leave the Seventh Day Baptist Church, 202 N. Washington Ave., at 12:30 pm Monday-Friday. Children will be dropped off at the church at 5:00 pm Monday-Thursday. Children stay overnight on Friday.

Camp ends at 12:00 pm on Saturday after the morning worship service at the Seventh Day Baptist Church. Campers will make a short presentation during the service. Please make every effort to attend. The service starts at 10:45 am. Children will be released to parents after the morning service. (usually around 12:00 pm.)

General Camp Information

A Health History Record with Emergency Care Permission Statement must be filled out before a child is permitted into Camp. The Camp Health Officer will screen children for any health problems as they come into Camp.

Children should eat lunch at home before leaving for camp. A snack will be provided daily.

Things to Bring to Primary Camp

Wear play clothes and bring a swimsuit and towel. For Friday, bring a sleeping bag or sheets and blanket, and pillow with case; swimsuit; church clothing; toiletries and towels.

Things Not to Bring to Camp

Do not bring music players, cell phones, or electronic games. Do not bring food, snacks, or beverages. These items will be confiscated until the end of the camp session.

### RULES OF CONDUCT

The purpose of camp is to provide spiritual enrichment and fellowship opportunities for youth. The objective of these guidelines on conduct is to provide policy and direction of appropriate conduct while at Camp Holston. These guidelines are based on Biblical principles and Christ-like behavior. It is hoped that these guidelines will assist in providing an environment where spiritual enrichment and fellowship can take place.

1. It is expected that youth will dress modestly and appropriately. The issue of modesty will be judged by the camp staff.
2. Youth will be careful of the language that they use, being sure that there is no cursing or coarse joking.
3. There will be no use of tobacco, alcohol, or drugs on camp property.
4. Public display of affection between boyfriends and girlfriends is not appropriate for camp.
5. Youth will be under the supervision of adult staff. It is expected that the youth will be cooperative and follow the instructions and requests of the camp staff.
6. Do not bring candy, food, or pop.
7. The health office and lodge bathrooms are off limits to everyone except camp staff.
8. Campers will remain in open areas of camp. Trails and wooded areas are to be used only with adult supervision.
9. Campers will stay within their own gender appropriate dorms.
10. Interactions or disregard of Camp rules or policies may constitute grounds for camper dismissal. The camper will be sent home at parents' expense after a conference with the staff and director.

I will pick up my child by the designated time that camp ends. I realize that adult supervision will not be provided beyond that time.
